What you need to know prior to selecting your courses

Please select your classes carefully! Discuss your choices with your parents/guardians!

High School students selecting Advanced Placement (AP) courses must complete the MOU linked here

You are making a **year-long commitment** to enroll in the courses you select. You may not drop a class because you changed your mind or do not like the grade you earned first semester. Program changes after the beginning of the school year are considered only if compelling circumstances warrant a change and class space is available. We value the importance of planning ahead and preparing for future success.

All students interested in sports, must complete the documents found on the Athletic Website at their home school.

9th and 10th graders will be enrolled in PE 1 or 2 until approved by the Coach & Athletic Department and concurrent enrollment has been submitted and approved.

CVA wants all students to be college & career ready. In helping students meet this expectation, we want to ensure each student is meeting the university A-G requirements. Meeting A-G demonstrates college readiness, regardless of career aspirations. We will work with each student to take the courses necessary to meet this requirement. Students are also encouraged to complete one of the Career Technical Education (CTE) pathways offered at CVA or at their home school via concurrent enrollment.

If you received a D or F grade for 1st semester or in a prior school year, you will be advised to attend summer school.

Summer school information will be shared with students/parents in March.

What is eLearning?

- Online learning classes that offer a 24/7 instructional option for self-directed students with proficient to advanced academic skills.
- Students communicate, collaborate, create, and learn through 21st century tools and skills.
- These classes are taught by AUHSD teachers and allow students and teachers to work together from a distance via the internet.
- Classes will meet at a minimum once a week, as determined by the teacher.

Space is limited Students who are accepted will receive a confirmation email from the district in the Spring. You will be expected to respond to the email - if you just read it and leave it, you will be dropped from the course. Read and respond accordingly.

What is Dual Enrollment?

- Cypress College partners with our school district to offer high school students the opportunity to earn college credit while attending high school. Student who complete a DE class earn BOTH high school and college credit.
- Students enrolled in free Dual Enrollment (DE) courses earn credit for college courses that may be eligible to transfer to a CSU or UC institution.

Two Dual Enrollment Options

Embedded Dual Enrollment (EDE)

These courses are offered during the school day and replace one of your periods. Often times it replaces a core class.

After School Dual Enrollment

These courses are available after school, but typically ONLINE and asynchronous. Just another great way to earn college credit.

Cautionary Note - students who do not pass a Dual Enrollment course with a C or higher or who earn a withdrawal fail (WF) will have a permanent mark on their transcript, both high school and college. This could adversely affect their college admissions or financial aid. Students should only take Dual Enrollment if they plan to put their best effort forward.

Do you read, write, and speak English and another language proficiently? Would you like the California Department of Education State Seal of Biliteracy on your high school diploma and a medal? Do you read, write, and speak English, as well as two or more languages proficiently? Are you interested in earning a plaque?

Requirements:

English Proficiency

- • Four years of English Coursework with 3.0 or higher Grade Point Average (GPA)
- Option 1: State Assessment: CAASPP- standard met or above
- · Option 2: Advanced Placement (AP) Assessment: 3 or higher
- · Option 3: International Baccalaureate (IB) Assessment: 4 or higher
- · Option 4: SAT: 480 or above

For English Learners (ELs): In addition to the requirements mentioned above, English learners must attain an oral language composite score of level 4 on the English Language Proficiency Assessments for California (ELPAC).

AND

Second World Language Proficiency

- Four years of World Language Coursework with 3.0 or higher GPA
- . Option 1: AP: Pass a world language AP examination with a score of 3 or higher.
- Option 1: AP: Pass a world language AP examination with a score
 Option 2: IB: Pass an IB examination with a score of 4 or higher.
- Option 3: ACTFL: Pass an ACTFL Writing Proficiency Test (WPT) and Oral Proficiency Interview (OPI) with score of intermediate mid or higher.
- · Option 4: District-Approved Assessment: Passing score for all sections






CVA Offers the following 2 Career Pathways:



ADVANCED PRINCIPLES OF HEALTH AND WELLNESS

Online JUNIORS & SENIORS COURSE

Course Overview. Advanced Principles of Health and Wellness assists students in developing greater responsibility for their health and wellness in all aspects of life. Topics include: Exercise science, nutrition, disease prevention and intervention, mental and emotional health, growth & development, effective communication, violence prevention, dangers of alcohol, tobacco and other drugs including prescription and OTC drugs, stress reduction, and integrative health care. Each student learns to analyze and evaluate the root causes of unhealthy behaviors to access a healthier, happier and more productive life. The course emphasizes skill building to help maintain healthy changes that last a lifetime. Meets University of California Entrance Requirements: UC approved "O" Elective (yearlona)

Honors & Advanced Placement (AP)

<u>CHALLENGE YOURSELF!</u> – Honors and AP Classes are more rigorous. The pace is faster because you will cover more material in the school year. Taking Honors or AP is a great way to prepare for college.

REVIEW - Review the requirements for the course (AUHSD Course Catalog) before selecting. Counselor will review your request(s), grades and teacher input will be considered

<u>PLAN</u> - Be sure you have enough time in your daily schedule to commit to the study requirements/workload.

STUDENTS PLANNING TO TAKE HP/AP/IB COURSES MUST REVIEW THE MOU WITH YOUR PARENT OR GUARDIAN

We want students to be mindful of the following when choosing between college prep courses and Honors/AP courses. Students who select honors or AP/IB courses are committing to **year-long** courses that will be challenging and require perseverance. Students in AP courses will be asked to commit to taking the AP exam of selected course. Due to the increased rigor in Honors/AP courses, students are expected to actively seek and use support opportunities.

Concurrent Enrollment

What is concurrent enrollment?

CVA students will have the opportunity to take up to two courses at their home school. AUHSD students may apply for concurrent enrollment at their assigned resident comprehensive high school for elective credit. Students may apply up to two elective courses (e.g., visual arts, performing arts, career technical education, world language); however, approval will be based on availability and enrollment at the time of request.

The following policies apply to concurrently enrolled students:

- 1. Students must maintain passing grades in all classes at school of residence and concurrently enrolled school. If a student is failing a class at either program, the administrator from the school of primary enrollment will determine if the student may continue concurrent enrollment.)
- 2. Students must maintain satisfactory attendance at school of residence and concurrently enrolled school. Students may be dropped for excessive absences and tardies.
- 3. Students will not be able to choose their school for concurrent enrollment. Placement will be made based on assigned resident high school, course(s) requested and availability at the requested school.
- 4. The course may be included in the required number of classes (six classes for 9th, 10th, and 11th graders; five classes for 12th graders); however, all students must take at least four classes or 240 minutes in their resident comprehensive high school. (Education Code 46100)
- 5. The district will not provide transportation services. Transportation is the responsibility of the student and family,






